

## <u>City Counsel Approves Contract to Evaluate Traffic Signals</u>

Simi Valley is taking proactive steps to improve its traffic signal system. The City Council has approved a nearly \$175,000 contract to assess and upgrade its 121 traffic signals to enhance reliability and ensure a smoother, safer driving experience.

This comprehensive study has been prompted by increased signal malfunctions, which cause prolonged red flashing lights at some intersections. The evaluation will document existing equipment, identify issues, and prioritize improvements to modernize the system and reduce disruptions.

This effort is part of Simi Valley's ongoing commitment to maintaining safe, efficient transportation for residents and visitors alike. .

## **SHARE THE ROAD:**

May is National Bicycle Safety Month, and the Simi Valley Police Department encourages everyone to get active while also reminding drivers to be on the lookout for people biking and walking.

## Drivers:

- Slow down & follow the speed limit. Be careful traveling through intersections.
- Look carefully for bicyclists & pedestrians before making a turn or opening a car door near streets or bike paths.
- Be patient when traveling behind a bicyclist and give them space when passing. California law requires drivers to change a lane, when possible, to pass bicyclists and always pass with at least 3 feet of space.
- Never drive distracted or impaired.

## Bike Riders:

- Use lights at night.
- Although not required for riders 18 & older, always wear a properly secured helmet. Helmets significantly reduce the chance of a head injury in the event of a crash.
- Bicyclists must travel in the same direction of traffic & have the same requirements as any slow-moving vehicle.
- Yield to pedestrians, just as a driver would. Pedestrians have the right-of-way within marked or unmarked crosswalks at intersections.

## **Earthquake Preparedness Month**

Simi Valley is joining communities across California in recognizing April as Earthquake Preparedness Month.

Residents play an important role in building a safer, more resilient City. Take a few simple steps to prepare today to access early warning tools, safety tips, and resources to protect yourself, your family, and your neighborhood before, during, and after an earthquake by

- **Know Your Risks:** Earthquakes can and do happen in Simi Valley. If the ground starts shaking, remember to *Drop, Cover, and Hold* On until the shaking stops. Visit <a href="https://www.earthquake.ca.gov">www.earthquake.ca.gov</a> for more information.
- Make a Plan: Every home is different. Create a customized plan for you and your family with the help of the City's "My Emergency Plan," available through the Simi Valley Office of Emergency Services.
- Prepare Your Home: Take steps now to secure furniture, appliances, and home fuel systems to reduce hazards
  during an earthquake. The California Seismic Safety Commission's "Homeowner's Guide to Earthquake Safety" is a
  great resource for getting started.
