

Water Use Efficiency Fact Sheet

The City has adopted a **Level 2 Water Supply Condition** calling for mandatory conservation actions.

Beginning November 1, 2021, the City of Simi Valley/Waterworks District No. 8 customers are required to follow these **water use mandates**:

- Two day per week watering schedule, based on home address (see chart above), and no irrigation between 9 am & 5 pm
- Irrigate no more than 15 minutes per zone, per allowed watering day (does not apply to low-flow drip irrigation and high-efficiency sprinkler nozzles)
- Use multiple, shorter irrigation cycles to eliminate or minimize excess water runoff
- No watering during (and for 48 hours after) measurable rainfall
- Cease washing exterior hard surfaces such as sidewalks and driveways, and wash vehicles using a hose equipped with a trigger shut-off nozzle
- Use recirculated water in decorative fountains, features and commercial car washes
- Fix all leaks, breaks, or malfunctions promptly

Up to 70% of residential water in Simi Valley is used outdoors, so it is especially important for us to irrigate efficiently and only when our landscape needs it.
